2017 News!

As our 9th year of service approached, a critical opportunity to increase internal capacity presented itself. In March VAN was awarded a 2 year \$150,000 grant courtesy of Meyer Memorial Trust to:

- 1) acquire new knowledge and skills to advance equity through WCNN's programs and services;
- 2) evaluate the effectiveness and relevance of WCNN; and
- 3) develop a strategy to advance equity and increase the impact of its essential work.

Â Since receiving the grant in May, WCNN has already made great strides towards its goals. We:

- Joined the Dialogues in Action cohort with Steve Patty to increase our qualitative evaluation skills. VAN staff has interviewed 15 individuals so far and is in the process of analyzing those interviews.
- We have hired a Strategic Planner, Thomas Bruner of Bruner Strategies to guide us in the process of building a strategic planning committee and
- Have set up the start of our Equity training, in part with the Center for Equity and Inclusion
